The Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA) is pleased to announce its hosting of the Second Asia/Oceania Meteorological Satellite Users' Conference, which will take place from 6 to 9 December, 2011, in Tokyo, Japan. The event is expected to be of particular interest to experts in the fields of meteorology, climatology and environment-related satellite observation.

Subjects

The conference will consist of verbal and poster sessions with respect to the categories outlined below. The program can be accessed on the conference web page at http://mscweb.kishou.go.jp/second/schedule.htm.

Session 1 Current and future satellite programs and systems

The history of earth observation from space spans more than 50 years, and technology for such monitoring is still developing. This session will feature satellite operators reporting on the latest status of satellite systems and related future plans.

Session 2 Facilitation of satellite data access and utilization

Facilitation of data access and utilization is currently in progress with a view to further enhancing the application of satellite data. This session will feature reporting on activities relating to satellite data exchange by satellite operators and utilization by national meteorological services and the international community.

Session 3 Satellite data application for the atmosphere, oceans and land

Earth observation from space is based on remote sensing techniques. This session will feature reporting on methods for retrieving parameters related to the atmosphere, oceans and land from satellite observation data.

Session 4 Earth observation satellites

The numerous earth observation satellites currently in operation provide a wealth of valuable monitoring information. This session will feature reporting on the latest developments relating to such satellites and application of the data they provide.

Session 5 (GEOSS/Asian Water Cycle Initiative (AWCI) related topics)

Session 6 Severe weather and precipitation

Satellite data are crucial for observing severe weather events such as tropical cyclones, heavy rainfall, thunderstorms and gusting winds. This session will feature reporting on satellite data analysis techniques for severe weather information and application to nowcasting.

Session 7 Application of satellite data to numerical weather prediction

Satellites provide spatially expansive, homogeneous and dense earth observation data, which are indispensable for numerical weather prediction. This session will feature reporting on application techniques for satellite data assimilation in numerical weather prediction.

Session 8 Climate

The history of observation using satellites spans more than 50 years, but its application in regard to the climate remains under development. This session will feature reporting on activities for satellite data application to climate monitoring.

The official language of the conference is English. No interpretation services will be provided.


• Internet service

The normal daily maximum air temperature is 12.4°C (54°F), and the normal daily minimum air temperature is 5.1°C (41°F) in December.

Tipping

Time zone

The time zone for Tokyo is Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) +9 hours.

Power supply and plug type

100 volts AC (50 Hz) is the Tokyo standard. The plug type for the power supply is A.

Travel to Tokyo

Narita Airport and Haneda Airport are the major international air hubs serving Tokyo.

From Narita Airport

Most international flights arrive at Narita International Airport, located about 60 km east of central Tokyo. There are many ways to get to central Tokyo. Please refer to the airport access information at http://www.narita-airport.ip/en/access/index.html.

• Airport Limousine Bus

Departures are approximately once every 15 minutes, and the trip to the Shiba Park Hotel/Tokyo Prince Hotel takes about two hours. The fare is JPY 3,000. More information is available at http://www.limousinebus.co.jp/en/.

Train

The two train services outlined below run from Narita Airport to central Tokyo. For directions from central Tokyo stations to your hotel, please see the hotel's website.

■ Narita Express

Departures are once every 30 – 60 minutes, and the trip to Tokyo Station takes about an hour. The fare is JPY 3,140. Although there are various destinations, all trains stop at Tokyo Station. More information is available at http://www.jreast.co.jp/e/nex/index.html.

■ Skyliner

Departures are approximately once every 30 minutes, and the trip to Ueno Station takes 40 to 50 minutes. The fare is JPY 2,400. More information is available at http://www.keisei.co.jp/keisei/tetudou/skyliner/us/.

• Taxi (not recommended)

Taxis are also available, but the trip to central Tokyo would be very expensive (JPY 15,000 – 25,000).

From Haneda Airport

Airport Limousine Bus

Departures are approximately once every 60 minutes, and the trip to the Shiba Park Hotel/Tokyo Prince Hotel takes about 60 minutes. The fare is JPY 900. More information is available at http://www.limousinebus.co.jp/en/.

Train

The two train services outlined below run from Haneda Airport to central Tokyo. For directions from central Tokyo stations to your hotel, please see the hotel's website.

■ Tokyo Monorail

Departures are once every 5 – 10 minutes, and the trip to Hamamatsucho Station takes about 30 minutes. The fare is JPY 470. More information is available at http://www.tokyo-monorail.co.jp/english/.

■ Keikyu Line

Departures are once every 5 – 10 minutes, and the trip to Shinagawa Station takes about 30 minutes. The fare is JPY 400. More information is available at http://www.haneda-tokyo-access.com/en/.
